Missional Serving Communities UNIT 3 - Week 1

PRAY – see – learn – serve

Objective: Our goal this week is to develop the desire to have God direct our praying so that our hearts more closely reflect God's heart

This week we're doing things a little differently and encourage you to meet OUTDOORS.

Begin by reading the Jesus Storybook Bible pp.18-25 (10 min)

What does this story tell us about creation or the world around us? How does God feel about creation?

According to this version of the Genesis story, what is God's hope for people and for creation?

Noticing Creation (10 min)

Take some time to notice God's creation around you. In small groups of 2-4 people, go for a short (5min) walk and look around. What do you see, smell, feel, or hear? In your small group, discuss all the different things you notice that God has made and what you like about it. Choose 1-2 things to share with the larger group.

Scripture & Prayer (30 min)

Take turns reading these passages aloud as a group. Pause after each passage and look around. Ask: How is this scripture reflected in what you see around you? Take a few deep breaths, and leave some open space for people to pray. Give people the option to pray aloud, to themselves, or to write their prayers in response to each passage. If you don't know how to start your prayer, consider using a word or phrase from the passage as a prompt.

- **Genesis 1:26-28** (The Message)
- God spoke: "Let us make human beings in our image, make them reflecting our nature So they can be responsible for the fish in the sea, the birds in the air, the cattle, And, yes, Earth itself, and every animal that moves on the face of Earth."

 God created human beings; he created them godlike, reflecting God's nature. He created them male and female.
 - God blessed them: "Prosper! Reproduce! Fill Earth! Take charge!

 Be responsible for fish in the sea and birds in the air, for every living thing that moves on the face of Earth."

Prayer Walk Activities

God's Masterpiece: Noticing details of God's creation (10-15 min)

- Do this activity in smaller groups of 3-4. Each group will need the "God's Masterpiece" handout and one paper frame.
- Follow the activity instructions.
- After 10 minutes, rejoin your group and share what you observed.

Pollution walk (do all together): Noticing damage to God's creation (10-15min)

- Read the following description of pollution to your group:
 - Human-generated chemicals, trash, noise, and heat are all pollutants, but so is ash spewing from an erupting volcano or smoke spreading from a forest fire.

Pollution is any contamination of air, water, or land that affects the balance of the environment.

- Take a walk as a group and identify the sights, sounds, and smells of pollution that may exist around you. Use the questions below as prompts:
 - Do you see, hear, or smell any signs of pollution? What is it?
 - Can you find examples of pollution on land, in the air, and in the water? Where?
 - Can you explain the source or cause of the pollution you have identified?
 - Who or what is affected by this pollution?
 - What might you do to help eliminate or reduce this pollution?
- Pray the following prayers:

Creator God,

Bless the tear we shed for the resources we have squandered.

Bless the sigh we breathe out for the atmosphere.

Bless the head we hang for the creatures lost and exploited.

Bless the hands we wring for the things we have broken and wasted. Bless us as we lament.

Cradle us as we regret.

Restore us as we start afresh. Amen - John Polhill

For our unwillingness to feel the suffering of others, and our readiness to live comfortably with injustice. Forgive us, O God.

For our self-righteousness that denies guilt, and our self-interest that strangles compassion. Forgive us, O God.

For our abuse of this planet

and our exploitation of its resources. Forgive us, O God.

For our failings in community

and our reticence to become involved. Forgive us, O God.

For the times we were too eager to be better than others, when we were too rushed to care,

when we were too tired to bother,

when we were too preoccupied to listen,

when we were too quick to act out of motives other than love.

Forgive us, O God.

May God forgive us, Christ renew us,

and the Spirit enable us to grow in love. Amen.

Litter pick up (10-15 min)

- As you clean up, pray for others who will be using the space.
- When you have finished with your litter pick up, take a few moments and pray the following prayer:

Creator God, you reveal yourself to us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, so as we gather in this place, come amongst us.
 Help us to discern your Spirit in the world around us. Let us find joy in the world that you created. Help us to worship you with all our being, and to hear and receive your word and your gifts.
 As we think about our local community and the glory of the natural world, may we respond to you in love for our neighbors and for your creation, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

- Which of the three activities (God's Masterpiece, Pollution Walk, Litter Pick Up) helped you see through God's eyes a little better? Why/How?
- Which of the prayers resonated with you the most? Why?
